- » Continuous assessments such as LibQual enable us to understand our users' needs to provide technologically equipped classrooms, more group study rooms, and in-house laptop checkout.
- » Library consortial participation (ORBIS Cascade and GWLA) and innovative buying arrangements (Purchase on Demand) enable us to provide our users free and convenient access to the universe of library materials. Another consortium (OCLC) provides our "next generation" catalog, WSU WorldCat, exposing users to amazing amounts of information worldwide.
- » Local partnering (Cougar Copies) provides us with an excellent photocopying and printing solution including wireless printing through Coug Prints; library location printing accounts for nearly 75% of all Pullman Campus Coug Prints activity.
- » Memberships keep us focused on the most up-to-date practices and trends and include the Association of Research Libraries (ARL), the Federal Depository Library Program (FDLP, since 1907), the National Network of Libraries of Medicine (NN/LM), and the Northwest Digital Archives (since 1974).
- » Campus academic partners include English Composition, World Civilizations, WSU Online, the Common Reading Program, and Freshman Focus.



- » Library Awards, such as the Library Faculty Award (for faculty library champions), give us presence in the community.
- » Open Access initiatives include the University's digital repository, Research Exchange.
