Research Statement:

I view my research as an eventuality of my daily work as a librarian. My current research interests involve demonstrating the value of library instructional efforts on student success. To that end, my work focuses on developing an environment that supports the assessment of instructional efforts while providing adequate incentives for participation from stakeholders.

Whereas my previous research had focused on providing an online environment to deliver and assess Information Literacy instructional efforts, my current efforts attempt to evolve the underlying framework affecting the instruction provided. The capture of adequate metrics for documenting instances of instruction individual students receive, will assist in finding correlations to student success in areas such as retention rates, GPA within a major, graduation rates, etc.
